Member-at-Large Manual Society for Integrative and Comparative Biology

Terms of Office.

There are three Members-at-Large who serve on the SICB Executive Committee. One Member-at-Large is elected each year for a three year term.

SICB Constitution Article III. Section 2.

Section 2. Executive Committee: The management of the Society shall be vested in an Executive Committee consisting of the executive officers, three Members-at-Large from the Society general membership, the Chairs of the Divisions of the Society, the Editor of *Integrative and Comparative Biology*, the Chair of the Graduate Student/Postdoctoral Affairs Committee, and the Chair of the Educational Council. Of the three Members-at-Large, one shall be elected each year for a term of three years. The Executive Director of the Society shall serve as an *ex officio* member of the Executive Committee, but may not vote.

Duties.

The Members-at-Large

- 1. are members of the SICB Executive Committee and are expected to participate in discussions, votes, and calls for information during the year.
- 2. must attend the SICB annual meeting and the two meetings of the SICB Executive Committee at the annual meeting during the term of service.
- 3. must be familiar with, and an advocate for, the entire scope of SICB's science and should not be specialists who value only one part.
- 4. must be familiar with the SICB Constitution and Bylaws governing the Society.
- 5. must be committed to the promotion of integrative and comparative biology in general.
- 6. serve on the Society-wide Nominating Committee in the final year of her/his term. (SICB Bylaws Article XV. Section 4)
- 7. resolve tie votes for Society-wide elections. (SICB Constitution Article III. Section 4)
- 8. serve on the Dorothy Skinner Award committee for two years; service begins as a committee member during the first year of the term; serves as committee chair during the second year of the term.
